- -K. Slater suggested reaching out to the Shoe Cobbler in Sarnia (beside Soups Up) as a possible sponsor. They repair a lot of hockey equipment and might be interested.
- -B. Jeffrey noted the plan is for Novice teams to play out of the Lambton/ Chatham Local League. If this decision changes, they will have until the scheduling meeting in September to loop back into WOGHL.
- -OWHA has approved the local league & has requested to be kept in the loop.
- -Jess Worton from Sarnia will run the local league. Scheduling meeting will most likely be early October.

2.6 Atom - Midget Program Update K. Slater on behalf of J. Nisbet

- -J. Nisbet and K. Slater to meet with Corey Ireland, coach of Atom 2 team to further discuss goalie options for the team. So far, no one has come forward about wanting to play the position. S. Vandenheuvel noted that pads and chest protector have been purchased for a goalie for this team.
- -Hockey school, run by Scott Jones of TPH, has held 3 out of the total 4 sessions. Feedback has been mixed with some members appreciating the focus on "correct skills" while others have found it boring & the players don't seem overly engaged. There have been approx. 12-13 players registered for each session Lady Flags may run a deficit on the program this year.
- -There were issues with the email inbox for the Treasurer account, so it is not clear on which families have paid because the emails were not received for a certain period of time. Board members discussed the option of PayPal or online registration system that tracks all of that on behalf of the organization. The downside is that a percentage of fees collected is kept to pay for the system.
- -May need to look at alternate provider for hockey school next year. -Suggestion: coaches participate on the ice in the Novice/ Atom 2 age group to ensure players are focused

2.7 Fundraising & Volunteer Update D. Fehr

- -D. Fehr noted the Captain Kidd beer can collection was successful & would encourage Lady Flags to take on that opportunity again if given the chance.
- -D. Fehr estimated that approx. 30 families will need to complete volunteer hours.
- -Bingo Training session is being held on Sept. 9 looking to recruit more Bingo volunteers to work them into the rotation.
- -Fundraiser BBQ being held on Sept. 7 at Men's 2-pitch Tournament.

3.2 Additional Qualification for Manager Role <i>K. Slater</i>	 -K. Slater suggested team managers obtain trainer certification as a backup. -The position would need to be rostered on the official roster so that they would be allowed on the bench (when the team trainer is unavailable). -Cost is \$96.05 to do the trainer's course. -Trainers are not supposed to be on a door on the bench; they are not to coach. Trainers should be watching for injuries.
