2.2 Finance Update K. Slater on behalf of A. Lane	 -K. Slater noted there are a few players trying the Instructional/ Initiation & will register if they want to continue. -Novice 2 and Atom 1 team should expect a refund from WOGHL. -All players have paid with the exception of a late registration to Atom 2 team.

2.5 Intro - Novice Program Update <i>B. Jeffrey</i>	 -B. Jeffrey noted Novice 1 has joined WOGHL as the competition in the local league will be mostly at the development level. WOGHL scheduling meeting will be next week Novice 2 has 8 games scheduled. -Initiation/ Instructional coaching staff has been determined. B. Jeffrey motioned for the Board to support Carol MacPherson running a few sessions during the Instructional/ Initiation timeslot to teach the fundamentals of skating. She charges approx. \$7/ player. J. Nisbet seconded, all in favour. -E. Hogan recommended having this new team staff complete the spreadsheet template to collect all of the necessary information to roster the team. 	-M. 2.6 Atom - Midget Program Update <i>K. Slater on</i> behalf of J. Nisbet	 -J. Nisbet does not recommend Scott Jones Hockey School for 2020. Mooretown Jr Flags will be running the boys hockey school next year and that might be an option for Lady Flags. -The Peewee team has played 1 exhibition game. -Atom 2 have their scheduling meeting next week. There are a number of players on the Atom 2 team who want to rotate through the goalie position. 	-K. Burgess to add a link/ button on MTMHA website to direct users to Lady
2.7 Fundraising & Volunteer Update <i>E. Nisbet/</i> <i>D. Fehr</i>	 -E. Nisbet noted a fundraising opportunity that was presented to Lady Flags: selling tickets to a Sarnia Legionnaire's Game for \$10/ ticket. E. Nisbet recommended that we do not take on this opportunity and focus on the Chuck-a-Puck event. -Chuck-a-Puck raised approx. \$1,700 last year. Board members recommended a prize for whoever sells the most amount of pucks. Tickets to the Factory in London were suggested as an incentive (E. Hogan can purchase discounted tickets through work). -K. Slater noted the fundraising budget for 2019-20: Soup's Loop - \$250 BBQ - \$1,000 Chuck-a-Puck - \$2,500 FlipGive - \$1,000 Spaghetti Dinner Event - \$2,500 	Flags website.

Nisbet/ D. Fehr will hold Parent Rep meeting. 	-E. Nisbet to reach out to coaches to determine Parent Reps and schedule a meeting.
2.8 Equipment Update <i>S. Vandenheuvel</i>	 -M. Routley learned about goalie equipment that fits overtop of existing equipment. S. Vandenheuvel looked into it and said it's quite expensive - approx. \$400 US. M. Routley suggested discussing this with MTMHA to see if they would share a set. -S. Vandenheuvel noted most teams have jerseys within their set that are too big & a lot of the sock sets came in bigger than anticipated. -Lady Flags will need to look at purchasing new sets of jerseys next year for some of the age groups. -Need to put together 2 more First Aid kits - recommendation to develop a guideline for first aid kits from new Head Trainer, Steve Forbes. -Lady Flags need to order more game sheets - white copies should be put into the slot in the coaches room for records. S. Vandeheuvel to install a slot for Lady Flags game sheets at the arena. 	-M. Routley to send an email to Board to introduce Steve Forbes, Head Trainer. -K. Burgess to add Head Trainer role to the

May look at a "festival" - OWHA is open to ideas. -Net sizes at Novice-level are optional - WOGHL uses regulation sized nets. Game sheets will still be used but there will be no score and no penalties. -Lady Flags will create a Facebook group for Trainer's. There is currently a Manager's Facebook Messenger group. M. Routley will be establishing a separate Messenger group for photos that could be used for Lady Flags social media.
